Dear partners and supporters, dear parents and enthusiasts, dear new applicants, candidates, servants abroad and alumni,

Busy, but also fulfilling months lie behind us: Once again, we were able to send a total of 127 volunteers (who form the 2023 cohort) to partner organizations all around the world - the vast majority of whom will reach their halfway point at the end of this month. We have already received 92 interim reports and this month we will already be saying goodbye to our first servant abroad who is becoming a new alumnus.

At the same time, the 2024 cohort is now entering the 'hot phase'; as there are around 160 interested candidates, but only between 120-130 places available, we even had to set up a waiting list this year. We hope that a few "competitions" can be resolved in the coming weeks and that suitable places can still be found for the vast majority of them!

This time we would like to give a small insight into our Gedenkdienst partner in Dallas, USA:



Gedenkdiener Matteo Hubalek at the Ackerman Center for Holocaust Studies in Dallas, USA reports:

The Ackerman Center was founded in 1986 by Dr. Zsuzsanna Ozsváth. It's part of the University of Texas at Dallas and thus has university funds and private donations at its disposal. University courses in Holocaust Studies are offered and research is conducted in the area of genocide. The faculty consists of a handful of professors in the fields of history, literature and film. The current director of the center, Dr. Nils Roemer, is also the dean of the Bass School of Humanities. The Center also has an extensive library and a large collection of literature on the Holocaust. The Ackerman Center cooperates with many renowned organizations, such as the American Jewish Committee, the USC Shoah Foundation and the United States Air Force Academy.

The work of the on-site Gedenkdiener includes collaborating on faculty projects and the Digital Studies Project. This uses the PowerBI software to graphically and statistically display data on the Holocaust. The memorial servants also have the opportunity to deal with topics individually. They work completely independently and can therefore also engage very closely with the subject matter. There are also several conferences at the university and outside every year. I had the opportunity to take part in a conference at the United States Air Force Academy. I got to know many committed individuals there and also learned more about the US Air Force's military stance on human rights and war.

The Center offers a really exciting atmosphere and is therefore perfect for motivated and independent Gedenkdiener.
